- location of observation
- drawings

Use Your Senses

While you're outside, try to use some of your other senses to describe what can you hear, smell, and feel.



MAKING OBSERVATIONS

An important part of being a Naturalist is making observations of the world around you. A great place to get started on your journey is with **Nature Journaling**, or drawing and writing about what you see in nature.

HEAD OUTSIDE

Spend a few minutes observing a natural object (plant, animal, rock, leaf). Then describe it using drawings and written notes.

If you're stumped, ask yourself: What do you notice about your piece of nature? What do you wonder about your piece of nature? What does your piece of nature remind you of?

Make sure to note where and when you observed your piece of nature.
